

## MARSHALLING PROCEDURES

Please ensure swimmers have reported to the Marshalling Point five heats prior to their heat.

**For Example: For this meet if entered in Event 3 heat 1, the swimmer must be at the Marshalling point before the start of the first heat of Event 2.**

Swimmers in each heat should be aware of their lane number and will be invited onto the pool deck five heats prior to their heat. Technical Officials will be there to assist.

## MARSHALLING POINTS

For boys and girls individual events the Marshalling Points are located as follows:

For Western Stand teams. (MNW,MNE, W, SESA,M&P,ACT & MSE) near the doorway opposite the Starter

For Eastern Stand teams (C&V,NC,NE&NW,MSW,SISA) in the hallway entrance to the pool deck ,underneath the grandstand, on the starters side of the pool.

If your Area is located at the Utility pool end of the venue, please use the back corridors underneath the grandstand to the marshalling point at the start end.

**Please keep off pool deck until the Clerk of Course calls your heat number.**

One **Team Manager** from each team is requested to be in the vicinity of their respective Marshalling Point to assist when their swimmers are called by the Clerk of Course.

Where a swimmer has difficulty in reporting for their heat by the required time, it is recommended that their representative report to the Clerk of Course on their behalf prior to the event closing.

Once reported, a swimmer should not leave the marshalling area unless approval is first obtained from the Clerk of Course.

## Relays.

**Team Managers to direct swimmers 1 & 3 to the 100m start end.**

Western Stand Teams will wait in the marshalling chute until called.

Eastern side Teams will wait in the Shane Gould Room hallway until called.

**Swimmers 2 & 4** to the 50m Speedo Heats start end in the same way as for the individual heats.

**Coaches or parents are not permitted to be in the Marshalling Area or on the pool deck. Refer Swimming New South Wales Ltd. Swimming Rule SW10.17.**

In the event of there being sufficient withdrawals from the heats of an event, which would enable the number of heats to be reduced, the Referee may at their discretion either amalgamate heats by filling vacant lanes in a heat or heats with those swimmers whose heat has been cancelled, or reseed the whole event.

All entrants in meets conducted by Swimming New South Wales must abide by and be subject to all the Swimming New South Wales General Rules, Swimming Rules, Open Water Swimming Rules, By-Laws, Policies, and published procedures in accordance with General Rule GR3.2
