Referee Course

Swimming NSW is calling for applications for its inaugural Referee Course. The aim of the Course is to educate and develop 20 Technical Officials to become Referees by the end of 2020.

The SNSW TSC, with guidance from the Area Technical Swimming Committee Co-ordinators, will select up to 20 Officials to participate in the Referee Course. The Course will commence in January 2020 and will run until November, with the aim to have candidates complete their level 1 Referee Assessment.

The normal Accreditation process will still occur outside of this Course – it is not a requirement to complete this Course to become a Referee.

The Course will be led by a Course Manager who will host either a Webinar or face to face sessions every 6-8 weeks throughout the year with candidates to complete course work between these sessions. The Course will also feature guest presenters on specific topics of expertise, include a detailed curriculum specifically aimed at preparing the candidates to be competent Referees and how to source a mentor.

To be eligible for this Course, candidates must meet the following criteria –

- Swimming NSW Member;
- Valid Working with Children Check;
- Hold four current Technical Official accreditations (in addition to General Principles); and
- While not essential, it is desirable that candidates hold Inspector of Turns and Judge of Stroke accreditation.

2019 NSW Senior State Age Championships

Appointments for Big State will be disseminated soon. The TSC would like to provide the following information on the Appointment process for State Senior Age Championships —

- Particularly for key positions at Big State (Referee, Starter, AOE, and Marshal) preference
 is given to individuals who nominate for both sessions (Heats and Finals) on any given day.
 This helps to ensure a consistent approach in key roles across both sessions;
- If there are several nominations for a position, the TSC will take into consideration the number of sessions/days for which an individual has nominated;
- From time to time, there can be variations depending on the numbers of Technical Officials who have nominated and individual pathways.

The Swimming Australia TSC now requires that Technical Officials who wish to be assessed for Level 3 suitability for Starter or Referee, need to be assessed over **two** days at Meets with a Heat and Final format.

Swimming Australia Rule Changes

The Board of Swimming Australia recently approved changes to the following governing documents:

- Swimming Rules
- By-Laws for the conduct of Australian Swimming Events
- Facilities Rules

Changes to the Swimming Australia Rules covers areas such as Management of Competitions, Impaired Swimmers and Records.

Of note in the changes to the By-Laws are changes to swimsuit guidelines which allows for Women's swimsuits to extend below the groin.

Swimming Australia Facilities Rules now directly reflect the FINA Facilities Rules –

- Dive Entry for Competitive Swimming Policy
- Swimming Australia use of Backstroke Ledges memorandum
